The feeders or volunteers are capable to win the dogs' heart, making it easier way for them to get the dogs vaccinated/ sterilized. Some Important Legal Facts and Provisions

- I Article 21 of the Constitution of India protects all forms of life, including animal life.
- II In addition, Article 51A(g) urge on all citizens a fundamental duty to have concern for living creatures. The Supreme Court of India has elucidated Articles 21 and 51A(g) to mean that animals have a right to lead a life with intrinsic worth, dignity and security.
- III The Central Government has enacted a law specifically with regard to animals, namely, the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960. Under the rules, the Animal Birth Control Rules, 2001 ('ABC Rules') have been draw up and lay down extensive rules relating to stray dogs, amongst others. Under the ABC Rules, stray dogs are to be sterilised, immunize and subsequently released into the same area, from where they were apprehended. The Rules also impart that dogs who are sick are to be medicate, preceding to their sterilisation and vaccination.
- IV The Constitution of India gives precedence to the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 and the Animal Birth Control Rules, 2001 over state and local laws, such as the Kerala State Municipality Act, 1994, under which Section 438 empower the Secretary to order the "capture and disfigurement" of stray dogs in a local area. In a recent development, Rule 13 of the ABC Rules provides that "in case of any conflict between the Rules and local laws, the provision that is less irksome to the animal shall prevail."

Allow them to rest in public and around your home:

Make a place and allow stray dogs to rest in spaces close to your home, shop and complex, and also allow them in temple premises or trade complexes which are belong to particular society with permission of head of the society It is not good when people extend their boundaries illegally by grabbing public land and out the strays to sit in that space

Adopt a Stray:

Instead of trying for foreign & costly breed of dogs, we can choose a stray. They are low maintenance and are as good and dedicated to their family members throughout life time. The best place to adopt a stray is from either a shelter home or just a roadside. They deserve that chance. It would be an upright effort as well. However, after adopting them, do not give up or abandon them due to your personal reason (transfer order or relocation of house etc.)
